1st & 2nd June & 7th & 8th September 2024

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

Caithness Car Club Ltd will organise RS Interclub sprints on the 1st & 2nd June and on the 7th & 8th September 2024 at Littleferry, Golspie. The Littleferry layout will be run on 1st June and 7th September while the Kylestrome layout will be run on 2nd June and 8th September.

The Littleferry Circuit is 2223m long and consists of 2.75 laps, the Kylestrome Circuit is 1722m long and consists of 1.75 laps.

1. These meetings will be held under the General Regulations of the Motorsport UK (MSUK) (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these supplementary regulations, Guyson Scottish Sprint & Hillclimb Championship regulations, Blackadders LLP Highland Speed Championship regulations and the Cross Border Speed Championship regulations.
2. The MSUK permits have been applied for and each weekend will be run under one permit.
3. These events are open to (a) all fully elected members of the organising club and (b) Members of all MSUK recognised clubs in Scotland that organise events in the Guyson Scottish Sprint & Hillclimb Championship, Scottish Speed Championship, Blackadders LLP Highland Speed Championship and The Cross Border Speed Championship (XBC).
4. All competitors must produce a valid competition licence, club membership card and the appropriate vehicle documentation.

The June event will include;

- Rounds 5 & 6 of the Guyson Scottish Sprint Championship (SSC).
- Round 5 of the Scottish Speed Championship (SS).
- Rounds 9 & 10 of the Blackadders LLP Highland Speed Championship.

The September event will include;

- Rounds 11 & 12 of the Guyson Scottish Sprint Championship
- Round 11 of the Scottish Speed Championship.
- Rounds 23 & 24 of the Blackadders LLP Highland Speed Championship.
- Rounds 19 & 20 of the Cross Border Speed Championship

All are rounds of the CCC Championship.

The programme of events will be **1 practice run and 3 timed** runs each day. This may be subject to change on the day at the discretion of the Clerk of The Course.

5. To enable a prompt start to the event, all cars will be scrutineered in situ and in strict class order. Drivers in road car classes should ensure that they are ready for scrutineering at this time; otherwise they may risk missing first practice.
6. As each weekend event is being run under one permit, scrutineering will take place on Saturday only. Scrutineering will only take place on Sunday for drivers that have not attended on Saturday.
7. Any competitor not signed on by 0900hrs (sat) or 1000hrs (sun) may be excluded from the event.

The event will consist of 24 classes as follows:

8. All vehicles must comply with the relevant Motorsport UK Technical and Safety requirements.
9. Cars will start singly as per running order, which will be issued at the start of each event. The starting signal will be a green light. The starting signal will be electronic with a light beam operating switch. The finish line will be indicated by the display of a chequered flag. In the event of a false start, a car can be restarted if the car has stopped within the beams. Drivers may only be allowed to attempt a start 3 times.
10. At the event competitors will have the opportunity to practice in accordance with S 2.1. Competitors are advised to walk the course before the start of practice. Newcomers must walk the course before the start of practice.
11. All cars will be identified with competition numbers. These must be clear and visible to the timekeepers. A limited number of black competition numbers will be available for sale at signing on.
12. All cars must have clearly identified front or rear towing points.
13. Results will be posted online and sent via email to all competitors. Queries should be submitted electronically, by telephone, text message or video call. This may be subject to change.

Awards will be presented as follows:

FTD Overall	- Trophy
First In Class	- Trophy

Second in Class	- Trophy (if there are more than 5 competitors in class)
Third in Class	- Trophy (if there are more than 10 competitors in class)

14. The maximum entry for the meeting is 70, the minimum is 50. The organisers reserve the right to cancel the meeting should the minimum number not be met. The organisers reserve the right to amalgamate classes if necessary.

15. Entries close finally on **Friday 17th May** for the June event and **Friday 23RD August** for the September event.

16. Entry fees will be cashed before the event. Any competitor who has insufficient funds in their account to cover their entry fee will be removed from the entry list and the place will go to the next competitor on the reserve list.

Cheques should be made payable to Caithness Car Club Ltd. Payment can also be made by BACS. Cheques will not be accepted on the day.

The driver is the holder of the entry not the vehicle.

18. Entries will be accepted by order of receipt, and at the discretion of the organisers.

19. **Withdrawals/Refunds** – a full refund will be given for any withdrawals prior to signing on. A refund will be granted minus an admin fee of £30 for any withdrawals after signing on. A refund will only be granted where the driver informs one of the event officials prior to withdrawal.

20. Notification of acceptance will be via email on receipt of entries. Final Instructions and results will be sent out by e-mail unless otherwise stated on the entry form.

22. Red Flag signal will be in accordance with S 9.3.7 (b) will not apply.

23. **Track limits must be obeyed. Any breaches may incur a time penalty at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.**

24. A Timing Strut in accordance with S 10.9 is required. Checks may be carried out in accordance with S 10.9.1 & D25.1.14, D35.1, G15.1.4 & H39 regarding the use of alcohol or drugs.

25. **Protests** - Any protest must be lodged in accordance with C5.

26. Competitors must note that any competitor-recorded videos are the property of the Motorsport UK and may have to be surrendered as required by the Motorsport UK's rules.

27. **It is the intention of CCC to do live streaming at the events.**

28. Competitors should note that the venue does have time restrictions imposed on its use. In view of these restrictions, competitors are asked to ensure that they are ready to take their runs on time to assist the smooth running of the event.

29. Competing Cars plus one support vehicle will be parked according to the Paddock Plan, which will be issued with Final Instructions. Trailers must be parked in the designated trailer park if room does not allow in the paddock. Parking of vehicles will not be permitted on

the tarmac roads within the paddock. This is for safety reasons; failure to comply with this request **may result in exclusion from the event.**

30. Competition cars must **NOT** be loaded onto trailers in the paddock before the end of the event unless permission is given by the COC.

31. CCC reserves the right to cancel / postpone the event and reschedule to a later date.

32. Only PUMP FUEL or METHANOL may be used at Golspie.
